You, God, are my God, earnestly I seek you; I thirst for you, my whole being longs for you, in a dry and parched land where there is no water. I have seen you in the sanctuary and beheld your power and your glory.

Because your love is better than life, my lips will glorify you. I will praise you as long as I live, and in your name I will lift up my hands. I will be fully satisfied as with the richest of foods; with singing lips my mouth will praise you.

On my bed I remember you; I think of you through the watches of the night. Because you are my help, I sing in the shadow of your wings. I cling to you; your right hand upholds me.
Psalm 63:1-8 (NIV)

This Psalm was written by David while he was living in exile in the desert. He had fled from Jerusalem, leaving everything behind as his enemies pursued him. He is in a very barren place, both physically and spiritually. He describes his condition as being in "a dry and parched land where there is no water."

With his next thought, he remembers God's faithfulness in the past; "I have seen you in the sanctuary and beheld your power and glory." David reminds himself, and us, that we should never forget in the days of darkness and trouble what we have learned in the days of light and comfort.

We tend to forget God's past faithfulness. David teaches us in this Psalm that we ought to call upon God even through the darkest times. The God who is with us in the light will guide us in those days we experience darkness and trials. If you are experiencing a time in a "dry and parched land," seek God's presence and trust in His deliverance. Lift your hands in praise and meditate on His goodness. God's presence and love are more satisfying than any of our earthly needs. Peace, Pastor Kenn

### **East Ohio Conference News**

Our cooperative parish's charge conference is Nov. 1 at 4 pm at the Fusion Community Church (110 North Main Street, Killbuck OH 44637).

A charge conference is an annual meeting of the leadership of a pastoral charge presided over by the district superintendent. The work of the charge conference includes reviewing the mission and ministries of the charge, adopting a budget for all congregations within the charge, recommending candidates for ordained, lay or other forms of ministry, setting salaries and compensation for pastors and staff appointed by the bishop, and more. The Staff Parish Relations Committees from all of the churches in the cooperative parish have been working to set Pastor Kenn's salary and five year plans for each church. All members of the congregation are welcome to attend, and the more members there to vote to approve the work of the SPRC, the better. Put it on your calendar!

Bob Catchpole, Central Valley District disaster response co-coordinator, is leading a disaster response team from Ohio to New York September 14-18. The team will use chainsaws, clean up debris, stop damage, and may make repairs where possible for multiple locations in Oneida, Madison, and Tioga counties southeast of Syracuse. This area experienced severe storm damage and flooding in June. The team will be housed in basic facilities using local churches. Both UMCOR Early Response Team (ERT) certified and non-ERT trained volunteers are welcome.



# **Facilities Updates**

Summer has been a busy time of repairs and updates to both the church as well as the parsonage.

We feel it is important to be transparent on where your contributions are being used, beyond our monthly expenses. Here are the updates and the costs incurred:

- Vestibule ceiling replaced. \$1596.00 (we were able to save \$500 by having the maintenance team remove the old ceiling.)
- Church Roof: \$4582.00 replace the most damaged shingles and the ridge cap. (this buys us 3 years before the roof needs replaced.)
- Mini-split for the Fellowship Hall Kitchen \$5300.00
- 2 Mini-Splits for the Parsonage \$7950.00- provides air conditioning and heat . Part of the funding for this project is provided by the Cooperative churches contributions.

Additional needs for the church:

Repair the cracks in the concrete ramp and fix the railing. Education wing windows need to be reglazed

We are also writing grants to build a handicapped bathroom on the same level as the sanctuary.
