And he called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He charged them to take nothing for their journey except a staff—no bread, no bag, no money in their belts—but to wear sandals and not put on two tunics. And he said to them, "Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you depart from there. And if any place will not receive you and they will not listen to you, when you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." So they went out and proclaimed that people should repent.

I sometimes wonder why Jesus sent the disciples out two by two. You'd think they could cover more ground if they went out individually. But then I remember that the kingdom of God is built through relationships. Jesus taught us that where two or three gather in his name, he is there among us. He also said that the world would know we are his disciples by the way we love one another. So, he sends his disciples out in pairs to not only preach the Word, but to demonstrate it together.

The Trinity exemplifies the harmonious development of relationships within a divine community. As the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are indivisible, so should the members of God's people strive to emulate this unity. Our weekly prayer reflects this aspiration, expressing our desire for "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

Jesus sent his disciples two at a time and told them not to bring anything for their journey. When my son was in Boy Scouts, they always stressed being prepared. But Jesus changed what it means to be prepared as we go out. To be prepared, we need to trust and rely on God's presence, power, and provision. When we live in the kingdom life, we find that the greater the risk we take, the greater the reward. Peter was the only disciple who was brave enough to get out of the boat and walk on the water toward Jesus.

Let us be bold and courageous and embark on a journey together to disciple new individuals. Jesus commissions us to engage and connect with people. The establishment of the kingdom of God commences with the cultivation of relationships. Without establishing personal connections, we cannot effectively disciple others.

East Ohio Conference UMC Disaster Response has been invited to coordinate a team of individuals to deploy to Wisconsin November 14 for a three- or four-day mission. The team will work in the Milwaukee, Waukesha, and Washington County areas of southeast Wisconsin that in August suffered its worst flash flooding since 2008. Both Early Response Team (ERT) trained and non-trained individuals may participate. All volunteers must be aged 18 or older. Work will include mucking out houses and other flood clean up. Housing and some meals will be provided by local churches.
