
Let me ask you, when was the last time you worried about something? How did you handle it? It seems like we live in a culture full of worry. As we begin a new year, we often have worries, fears and insecurities about the things we cannot control.

Jesus says that there is no benefit to worrying. "Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?" If anything, worrying subtracts from our lives. Worrying is like being stuck on a hamster wheel - you are frantically moving and working hard, and yet not actually going anywhere.

Instead of worrying, Jesus invites us to redirect our energy and thoughts toward something better: "But above all pursue his kingdom and righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. So then, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Today has enough trouble of its own." (Matthew 6:33-34, NET)

As those who live seeking the kingdom of God, we live under a different ethic and ethos than the culture around us. Instead of worrying about the things the world throws at us, we are invited to step off the hamster wheel and build our lives on our Rock, Jesus. There is where we find stability, purpose and freedom to live as God's beloved children.

As of December 17, we have served 1,998 meals! From our profits (and remember, this is intended to fill a need in our community, not necessarily be a fundraiser) we've been able to give \$150.29 to the General Fund, \$1,508.93 to our Kitchen Fund, and \$1,659.22 to Apportionments. And we still have a soup meal on Dec. 30! Using our Kitchen Fund profits, we've been able to add a mini split air conditioner to the kitchen and are looking forward to adding convection ovens.

We've been the thankful recipient of many donations from Walnut Creek Foods, and recently received a lot of sausage and other pork cuts from the Grimwood family. We look forward to serving some tasty meals using it in 2026. Additionally, the team thanks all of you who donated food or supplies, ate the meal or invited others. You are all amazing!

There have been lots of laughs, lots of reassuring Robin that it will all work out well, and lots of great friendships formed in this work. We currently have 23 people on our team, but are always looking for more to join. Just call or text Robin Hughes at 570-807-1970. Thanks again for supporting this mission of our church.

- Money was dispersed from The Endowment Fund. \$1,500 was placed in missions. \$4,500 went into the general fund. \$4,500 went back into the Permanent Endowment. \$4,500 of Trustees money will go into the Building Fund. The church will need to start thinking of how to pay for a new roof in 3 to 5 years. The Board is still looking for volunteers to help brainstorm ways to raise \$80,000+
- 16 baskets for shut-ins have been assembled. They will be delivered as soon as possible.
- It was decided to give \$500 to the Loudonville Theater in the coming year to support the community.
- Pastor Kenn is looking into having a one night weekday church for families in our community who work weekends. He is going to use some of the ideas from the “Messy Church” which come from the book “Let the Children Lead”. Tammy Kindle will be helping him get in touch with families that are interested in this idea.
- Barb Burd and Eric Stitzlien will head up a group to find help for our church community who need help in their home. If you are interested in helping do jobs or in need of help please let the office know. Keep an eye out for more info into this new mission project.

East Ohio Conference News

The United Methodist Higher Education Foundation Board of Trustees has unanimously selected the Rev. Cara Stultz Costello as its next president and CEO, effective January 1, 2026. She will be the first female president in the 60-year history of the Foundation.

"It is a profound joy to assume the presidency of UMHEF, a ministry whose sixty years shine with God's faithfulness and the Spirit's sustaining presence," Stultz Costello said in a release issued by the Foundation. "Inspired by Philippians 1:6, I am confident that God, who began this good work in us, will carry it forward. With our United Methodist institutions of higher learning, Annual Conference foundations, connectional collaborators, and generous partners, we will continue to equip and empower students to follow God's call and participate in building a world marked by love, hope, and transformation."

Stultz Costello has served as the interim leader of the UMHEF since September following the death of Bob Fletcher and is being named to the position full-time after a nationwide search for the next president & CEO.

Bishop Hee-Soo Jung has announced his intention to appoint the Rev. Dan Bryant to serve as interim superintendent of the Central Valley District from January 1 to June 30, 2026. He has served in the East Ohio Conference since 1990 as the pastor of several churches, superintendent of the Mahoning Valley District, and dean of the Cabinet.

Bishop Hee-Soo Jung invites you to The Holy Land, the Holy People Trip to Israel scheduled for April 6 – 15, 2026. The tour will be led by The Society for Biblical Studies (SBC), an ecumenical, interfaith and inclusive organization. SBC seeks to renew the mission of the Church by making this experience contextual and grounding it in biblical faith. You are invited to participate in a ministry of reconciliation, to reach out across geographic, religious, ethnic and cultural boundaries to new horizons of mission. At 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, January 18 Bishop Hee-Soo Jung will be part of a special service honoring Rev. Dr. King at Clair UMC in Columbus. You are invited to attend in-person or via livestream. The theme for this year's celebration is "Bending the Arc: Building the Beloved Community in Our Neighborhoods".

Conference Council on Finance & Administration has approved local churches not being billed in 2026 for the flat rate, the 3% pensionable pay, and the 4% church match for the new Compass Clergy Retirement plan that begins January 1. The decision was made to give churches the opportunity to use some of the funds budgeted for Compass payments in 2026 on other ministry projects.

Learn best practices for responding as a volunteer in disaster situations on Jan. 17. Training includes how to interact with survivors, how to assist survivors recover belongings, how to tarp roofs, and how to safely remove debris. Successful completion of the training and a background check by United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is required to receive your credentials as a certified UMCOR Early Response Team (ERT) volunteer for three years. Cost of the training is \$25/person, which includes training materials, a t-shirt, lunch, and the required UMCOR background check. 


Operation Christmas Child

Year-Round Shoebox Collection

February	Hair bands, clips and barrettes, hair brushes and combs.
March	For the older kids: Tape measures, flashlights with batteries, small tool kits, sewing kits, heavy bright colored thread.
April	Outdoor fun: small rubber balls, jacks, chalk, jump ropes, yo-yos, deflated soccer balls and pump
May	Individual packaged toothbrushes, including children's sizes, band aids for kids
June	Small dolls, matchbox cars, decks of cards, card games
July	Watch for the picnic supplies sales: any plastic cups, bowls, heavy plastic utensils, and any kind of refillable water bottles.
August	Shop the school supplies sales for small notebooks, pencils, pencil sharpeners, colored pencils, watercolors and crayons
September	Ball caps or sun hats
October	Collect any items yet needed. We'll send out a list.
November	Pack our boxes and pray for the children receiving them. Donate \$10 for shipping of each box.

Bingo Night





Script Report

In 2025, we ordered \$2625 worth of gift cards through RaiseRight, earning \$170.48 for the church's General Fund. Some people ordered using the app, in addition to our bulk order for Christmas. Thank you, all!

All together, the RaiseRight community raised over \$35 million (up from \$1.3 million last year) in over three million transactions, benefitting 15,325 organizations.
